FOREWORD

It gives me immense pleasure to present the 96th Annual Report for the year 2021-22. This report encapsulates the remarkable achievements in the pursuit of academic excellence by Andhra University. Andhra University, one of the oldest and premier multi-disciplinary Universities in the country, was established in 1926 and is going to celebrate centennial celebrations in the year 2026. Andhra University has been granted ISO 9001: 2015 Certification up to 2024 by TUV SUD, an International Certification agency and this ISO certification has a major role in ensuing NAAC Accreditation. There are 9805 students pursuing their studies in the University with both Undergraduate and Post Graduate programs put together. It has initiated implementation of NEP-2020 reforms for enhancement of quality of higher education with social relevance. Another



notable achievement is that the Andhra University is awarded prestigious ‘GREEN CHAMPION AWARD’ by Mahatma Gandhi Rural Council of National Education for the year 2021 for the efforts it has laid in waste management, plantation programs, solar energy usage, water management, reduction in plastic usage through the NSS cell of Andhra University. The Hon’ble Chief Minister, Sri Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy has inaugurated ‘American Corner’ which was established in the University Campus to provide required guidance to the interested students who plan to study in USA. The Grand Annual Alumni Meet ‘WAVES-2021’ conducted virtually on 11th December, 2021. The meeting was graced by Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Union Minister of State as Chief Guest and Justice D.V.S.S. Somayajulu, Judge, High Court of A.P., Mr. Purna R. Saggurti, Vice-Chairman, Bank of America, USA, Dr. Vinay Kumar Nandicoori, Director – Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, New Delhi, along with Founder President of Alumni – Shri G.M. Rao, as Guests of Honor.

Andhra University has created a benchmark in the declaration of examination results by releasing Engineering 4th Year 1st Semester Results within a record period of four days from completion of conduct of last day of examination. The placement record of the University colleges has crossed 79 per cent overall in campus colleges. Andhra University rolled out two full-fledged online programs viz., B. Com (Accountancy) & M.A. (Sociology) through School of Distance Education. As part of National Library week, Digitalization of *Talapatras* Program was launched in Dr. V.S. Krishna Library. During this academic year, the University signed several MoUs with various renowned organizations such as ‘Adani Institute for Education and Research (AIER)’, Ahmadabad, MSME Technology Centre, Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India, GAIT Labs, HPCL, Logistics Sector Skill Council, Tamilnadu, Dept. of Sainik Welfare, Rajya Sainik Board, Ashtanga Naturo Pathy, Ayurved and Yoga (ANAY), King George Hospital (KGH), Visakhapatnam, Talentedge Education Ventures Pvt. Ltd., Maha Bodhi Society, Bangalore, Aziant Drug Research Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Suraksha Pharma Private Limited, Hyderabad etc., In order to bridge the gap between University- Industry, the University has initiated steps to establish the Centre for Advanced-Applied Biological Sciences & Entrepreneurship (TCABS-E) Laboratory in the Dept. of Zoology under a MoU for encouraging Patenting and Startup activities. The Centre of Excellence in Maritime & Shipbuilding was inaugurated by Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, Hon’ble Union Cabinet Minister of Ports, Shipping and Water ways & Ministry of Ayush. A Portable Biosensor for Type 2 Diabetics developed by Dr. Aparanji, Dept. of Bio-chemistry, was commercialized as part of Technology License Agreement with M/s Akshaya Infotech, Visakhapatnam. The Andhra University launched the ‘AU-LOOKS’ Telugu weekly newsletter covering all the events and news items regarding Andhra University from January, 2022 onwards, in addition to ‘AU-SAMACHAR’ which is English newsletter. The digital versions of these newsletters are available in A.U. Website. The students opting for higher studies crossed 30 per cent overall in the campus colleges. The ‘H-index’ Citation of the campus research output reached above 40.

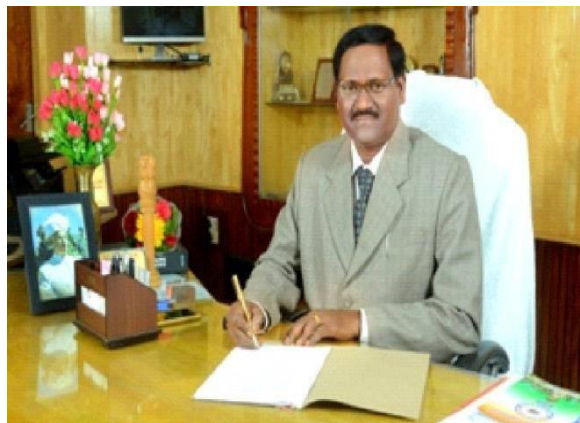

EDITORIAL

Andhra University has achieved a stable growth since its inception in 1926. The Andhra University's growth has been remarkable in terms of its infrastructure, number of academic departments, new courses introduced and various academic programs, the number of affiliated colleges and recognized institutions. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), of MHRD, has ranked Andhra University as the 36th ranking institution at all India level in 2022. The oldest university in the State Andhra University has NAAC Score of 3.60 out of 4.00 and the UGC recognized AU as Category-I University and accorded special status.



The academic year 2021-22 has been a year of certain specific challenges and commendable academic achievements. 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1. University at a Glance

Andhra University is one of the oldest educational institutions in India established in 1926 by the Madras University Act to cater to the northern districts of the erstwhile Madras Presidency. The University was the first to be conceived as a residential multi-disciplinary University, which also served as a residential, teaching-cum-affiliating University. The University is a trendsetter in Higher Education and University-Administration in many respects. In 2016, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) of India have reaccredited Andhra University with an “A” Grade with a Score of 3.60, on a four-point scale, valid until 2023. The University secured ISO 9001:2000 certification in 2006, ISO 9001:2008 certification in 2016, and at present certified as ISO 9001:2015 for its quality standards and maintenance of the same.

The University is a premier institute of higher learning offering a variety of programs in the emerging areas which have a direct impact on the economic growth and development of the society. The University has distinguished itself by the introduction of several courses which are innovative and first of their kind in the country. The University has Six Constituent colleges – A.U. College of Arts & Commerce, A.U. College of Science & Technology, A.U. College of Engineering, A.U. College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar College of Law, A.U. College of Engineering for Women, and A.U. School of Distance Education.

The University has 58 academic departments offering twenty-four Programs at UG level; ninety-six Programs at PG level and fifty-seven Ph.D. programs. In addition, the University has several Advanced Research Centers and one Advanced Analytical Lab, which is recognized as a National Facility. The University has achieved another distinction recently, by imparting education in allied fields, through Certificate programmes to defense personnel of Tri-Forces through several MoUs with the Director General Resettlement, Govt of India, for offering resettlement courses to provide employability skills based on the current market trends with relevant certification for their civilian employment opportunities and career prospects.

The pioneers of the University consistently accepted that greatness in advanced education is the best venture for the nation and drew in the administrations of well-known educationists, for example, Dr. T.R. Seshadri, Dr. S. Bhagavantham, Professor Hiren Mukherjee, Professor Humayan Kabir and Dr. V.K.R.V. Rao, to make reference to a rare sort of people who set elevated expectations for instructing and research. Nobel Lariat C V Raman was the glad former student of the University and intently related in establishing research frameworks in Physics. Padmavibhushan Prof. C R Rao, the prestigious analyst of the world, was likewise the pleased former student of the University. Keeping in pace with the worldwide needs and difficulties under the initiative and direction of progressive Vice- chancellors, the University is offering a few new Courses of prominence and contemporary relevance to industry and society.

2. Genesis and Growth

Ever since its inception in 1926, Andhra University has an impeccable record of catering to the educational needs of the Andhra region, in the erstwhile British Raj. The University is not just one of the oldest educational institutions in the country, but is also the first to be conceived as a residential and teaching-cum-affiliating University, mainly devoted to postgraduate teaching and research. The people of the State have a deep emotional attachment to the institution, since it came into being after a prolonged struggle of the Telugu people for a University in the educationally-backward northern districts of the erstwhile Madras Presidency.

Andhra University was constituted by the Madras Act of 1926. The 97-year-old institution is fortunate to have Sir C.R. Reddy as its founder Vice-Chancellor, Former President of India, Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, was the successive Vice-Chancellor, who strengthened the University with his impeccable planning and vision. Besides, over time, several visionaries and Vice-Chancellors were instrumental in strengthening this Magnificent University. The University started its research academic programme in 1936, with six students assisted by a handful of teachers. The strength of the students increased to 17 in the second year. The student strength rose to 2800 in 1966 and at present to 9805 mark excluding Ph.D students. The University is spread on a sprawling campus of 531.0 acres dotted with 121 buildings of Academic, Administrative and support services with a plinth area of about 20 lakhs sq.ft., and 336 staff quarters. At present, the University is catering mostly to the Educational needs of Visakhapatnam, and Vizianagaram, beside students from other parts of India and the world. There are 305 affiliated colleges spread across five districts under the territorial jurisdiction of Andhra University. The enrolment in Affiliated Colleges is more than one lakh.

Since the day of its inception, the University is maintaining its tradition of meeting global interface. The University has developed network with industry, business, NGOs and Government organizations. Many academic departments take up consultancy works in the form of projects, training, advisory, counselling, design, and so on. The University has established a University Development Centre to coordinate consultancy services and to act as liaison between the University and the client. The natural beauty of the campus with the serene blue waters of the Bay of Bengal on one side and the lush green Kailasagiri Hill on the other provides the right academic ambience, most conducive to learning.

Thus, with all the 97 years of its existence, individual achievements and positions occupied by the faculty and alumni, academic achievements, research output coupled with initiating new innovative courses, centres and institutes for the first time in the country, Andhra University has an impeccable record of catering to the educational needs and addressing the sociological problems of the region. It is relentless in its efforts in maintaining standards in teaching and research, ensuring proper character building and development among the students, encouraging community developmental programmes, nurturing leadership and patriotism in young men and women and imbibing a sense of responsibility to become responsible and responsive citizens of the country, while striving for excellence in all fronts. Whole vision as an educationist proved to be technical in the long run.

3. Academic Activities

1. Students Enrolled in the University During the Academic Year 2021-22.

Andhra University, being a State University, follows all the rules and regulations of the State Government in the admission process. As a public organization, the University keeps open all the admission information and makes the admission process truly transparent. The admissions are based on the eligibility qualification and the ranks secured by the candidates in the Common Entrance Test. Admission into all UG and PG courses of Engineering, Pharmacy, MBA, MCA, B.Ed., B.Ed. (Special Education), M.Ed., M.Ed. (Special Education), Law will be done by the State Government based on the ranks obtained in the respective common entrance tests along with minimum prescribed eligibility criteria in the respective qualifying examination as stipulated by the State Government. Notification for admission to different PG courses of Arts & Science and Diploma courses are done through Andhra University Common Entrance Test (AUCET) under the supervision of Directorate of admissions. Results are published through Andhra University website and the students are facilitated to download rank cards from the website. Counselling for admission into different PG courses in the campus colleges as well as affiliated PG colleges will be done through a centralized process.

A total of 3960 students have been admitted into various UG, PG, Integrated and Ph. D programmes for the academic year 2021-2022 as shown in the adjacent graph. There is a slight increase in the number of admissions and the Ph.D admissions shows the importance the administration has given for research.

2. Seminar/Conference/Workshops Organized & Attended During the Academic Year 2021-22

The University has an established culture of nurturing creativity and scientific temper among the staff. It encourages all the departments to organize Workshops, Training Programs, Seminars and Conferences. A total of 131 faculty have organized various seminars/conferences from various constituent colleges as shown below.

The University authorities encourage its faculty and Research Scholars to participate in various Workshops, Training Programs and Conferences held outside the University both within India and abroad and is in the forefront in providing financial aid to its faculty to attend various seminars/Conferences/workshops. A total of 147 faculty have attended various seminars/conferences from various constituent colleges as shown below.

3. Research Publications by the Faculty

In relation to publication of Research papers and articles, the University is encouraging its faculty members and Research Scholars to publish their research output in peer reviewed and SCOPUS Indexed Journals. As part of these publications, the University brings out five Journals in Advanced Sciences, Engineering Technology, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Law, Arts, Commerce and Management Studies. The University developed a structured plan for Research collaboration with reputed R & D organizations by way of entering into MoU's to have access to high technology laboratories and practical environment for experimentation. The results can be seen in the number of research publications during the academic year.

The University faculty are actively involved in research. A total of 794 research papers were published in peer reviewed journals and the above chart shows the number of research papers published by the faculty and research scholars of the constituent colleges during the academic year.

5. Extension, Outreach & Student Activities

10. Central Facilities

1. **Dr. V.S. Krishna Library** is the central library of Andhra University with two branch libraries i.e., (i) Engineering College Library, (ii) Law College Library working under its control.

Dr. V.S. Krishna Library has 60,000 sq. ft. (5574.18 sq. m.) of Carpet area. Besides the work and stock areas, each section has seating and reading facility to enable the user to choose and refer to the books comfortably. All the rooms are spacious with good ventilation. According to the need and convenience, one finds different seating arrangements. The seating arrangement is user friendly. To provide sufficient scope for optimum interaction among the users a seminar/group discussion room is provided. At a time 500 users can be seated in the library. The library is kept open on all days in the year including Sundays, except on national holidays and on days declared as holiday by the University. The library works in three shifts.

The Engineering College Library situated in the North Campus has a plinth area of 8,000 sq. ft. (743.22 sq. m.) with a seating capacity of 150. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Law College situated in South Campus has a plinth area of 3400 sq. ft. (315.87 sq. m.) with a seating capacity of 61.

The library is effectively using SOUL software. Special facilities are provided for differently abled persons. A separate unit of books in Braille has been developed for visually challenged students. Reprographic facilities are provided.

Manuscript Collection:

The library possesses a collection of 2663 rare and valuable manuscripts made of palm as well as leaf paper and original copy of the Constitution of India, signed by Members of the then Parliament.

2. **Agro Economic Research Centre (1968)** Agro-Economic Research Centre, Andhra University, Visakhapatnam is one of 15 Centres set up by Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India, to carry out research in agricultural economics in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha. It was established on 21st February, 1968. The Centre has opened portals of research in agriculture and rural development. It has endeavoured on several research areas which are very essential to policy formulation for Government of India, Government of Andhra Pradesh, Government of Telangana and Government of Odisha. Thus it has played a crucial role in the Policy formulation of agricultural and rural development for nearly five decades.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE CENTRE ARE:

- To carry out continuous study of changes in the rural economy and economic conditions of Agriculturists by means of surveys of a number of selected villages every year in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha.
- To conduct adhoc investigations into the problems in which the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare is specially interested pertaining to Agriculture.

- To carry out research work on problems relating to Agricultural Economics of the country and
 - To give technical advice to the Government of India and the State Governments concerned on such issues as with mutual agreement may be referred to the Centre.
3. **Centre for Studies on Bay of Bengal (2004)** The Andhra University, having realized the importance of natural resources of the coastal, near and off shore environments, climatic conditions, marine food and agricultural products, aqua culture and placers of the Bay of Bengal region, has established an advanced research center exclusively to study the Bay of Bengal and its environs. The Center as per the resolutions of the EC of Andhra University was initiated in June 2004 in the erstwhile glass technology laboratory building.

4. **Centre for NANO Technology (2001)** Centre for Nanotechnology is a Research and Development Centre situated at A.U. College of Engineering (A), Andhra University. Centre is having Research facilities worth around 5 crores and providing testing facilities to the colleges, Industries, Defence Laboratories throughout A.P. Centre for Nanotechnology is inaugurated on May 15th, 2011. Andhra University College of Engineering (A) possesses a vision to foster the development of research and education in the cutting edge technologies, multi-disciplinary, trans-disciplinary all Inter-disciplinary areas like nanotechnology by developing human resources gifted with leading-edge competitive technologies required for meeting the future challenges and augmenting academic partnerships with industry. It also offers M.Tech course in the stream of Nanotechnology. The faculty of the Centre, drawn from different departments as a Guest faculty for Centre for Nanotechnology and is actively involved in research in the area of nanotechnology. The Infrastructure development in the Centre is started in the year 2010 with the support of U.G.C.(MHRD) funds. This centre is also supported with the Centre of Excellence (CoE) in the year 2012 with a financial support of five Crores. This centre is established under TEQIP Phase II CoE (Centre of Excellence) entitled “Challenges of Nanotechnology for 21st Century Generation: Indian perspective in global scenario” in the year 2012 with the following thematic areas: i)

Multiscale Composites ii) Nano lubricants, Machining & Thin films, iii) Nano Composites iv) PEM Fuel Cells

7. **Population Research Centre (1978)**

The Population Research Centre, Andhra University, Visakhapatnam (sponsored by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi) was established in 1978 in Andhra University to undertake research on various demographic, social and economic aspects of population growth in Andhra Pradesh. This Centre also undertakes independent and in-depth



evaluation of the Family Welfare Programmes in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Odisha, West Bengal and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. It is a centre where the Research Staff are well qualified and experienced in survey research. Under the National Family Health Survey (NFHS) which is also intended to improve the survey research capabilities of the staff of the Population Research Centres, the Research Staff members of the Centre got trained in various workshops organised in India and abroad and are familiar with the use of different software packages.

15. **Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Study Centre** was established to study and research on the ideologies of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in student community.
16. **The Japanese Information & Study Centre** : The Japan Information and Study centre is the first being set up by Mitsubishi Corporation in a University in the country by the then Au authorities and the then managing director of Mitsubishi Corporation India Pvt. Ltd., Mr Masakazu Sakakida on December 14, 2015. The centre was supported financially by the Mitsubishi Corporation as part of its corporate social responsibility to the tune of Rs 27 lakhs for the year 2015-2016.

The purpose of the centre is to promote Japanese language and culture as India and Japan share their oriental culture as well as healthy traditions. The centre houses many artifacts of Japan in the study room and the class room to reflect Japanese culture, and many items like samurai, Kokeshi and Geisha dolls adorn the study room. Even the class room is furnished with wooden chairs, air-conditioners while cultural items of Japan have been embellished on the walls. These apart, several books have been kept in the study room for the Japanese learners. One ad hoc faculty is appointed to teach the Japanese diploma course to the students.

The admission into the 6-month diploma course begins in August every year. The admissions are made by the Directorate of Admissions of the Andhra University, located in the Vijayanagar

Palace, Pedawaltair every year, and a notification is given in the website, www.andhrauniversity.edu.in. The director of the centre can be contacted on the email: japaninfoau@gmail.com. The classes are conducted thrice a week, i.e. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

17. **NMR Research Centre** : NMR Research center, Andhra University has been rendering its services to academicians and researchers for the last 7 years. We have been supporting the research students in Andhra University as well as students from other academic institutes of AP and other states. We also offer our facility for the industries in Visakhapatnam. More than 3500 samples were analyzed in the academic year 2021-22. Our center has generated a revenue of INR 9 lakhs. We are approaching industries and other prospective customers to increase our userbase.

Trade Diplomas and PG Diploma awarded to candidates referred from IAF HQ, almost (500), PG Degree in Strategic Studies awarded for Officers undergone courses in CAW, Secunderabad. B.Sc in Hull Maintenance and ship building and PG Diploma in Shipbuilding Technology candidate's passedout from INS Viswakarma.

19. **Intellectual Property Rights** : As a part of implementation of the New IPR Policy 2016, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Govt of India, sanctioned DPIIT-IPR Chair to Andhra University in September 2020 under the Scheme for Pedagogy and Research in IPRs for Holistic Education and Academia (SPRIHA).

Prof. Hanumanthu Purushotham, the former Chairman & Managing Director of National Research Development Corporation (NRDC), Govt of India, was appointed as the DPIIT-IPR Chair Professor and the founding head of the CIPR, Andhra University. Ever since its inception, CIPR has been taking several new initiatives to build a strong IP ecosystem in the University and the state of AP. Considering the proactive initiatives of CIPR AU, the AP Government notified through GONO72 dated 12.05.2021 that CIPR Andhra University is the AP State IPR Nodal Agency.

IPR cell has conducted 42 workshops, seminars, keynote lectures delivered during the A.Y. 2021-2022.

Between July 2021 to June 2022, the IPR Chair and its staffs have conducted the mandatory 2-credit course classes and examinations on IPR for 1922 students.

22. **ā HUB** : Andhra University has established 'ā hub' (a section 8 company) with a vision to be a vibrant and sustainable India's largest integrated multi-disciplinary Incubation & Innovation Ecosystem of 2.0 Lakh sq. ft. by bringing multi sector-based Incubation Centers, Annex Centers, and Student Ideation Centers.

ā hub is a collaborative program designed to help create and promote entrepreneurs and solve some of the problems commonly associated with running a startup by providing workspace, seed funding support, mentoring, and training to grow their business.

A.G. Audit:

State Audit:-

The State Audit Department is the statutory Auditor of the University. A Separate Audit wing has been allotted to the University for conducting the post audit of the University and this office is located in the campus beside the Central Administrative Office (C.A.O)

This Audit Body oversees the receipt and expenditure audit of all the University Accounts, Principal's Offices, Hostels, Library, Press & Publications, Dispensaries, Engineering wing, SDE and all other wings of the University. After completion of the audit, an audit report for the year will be issued and is also communicated to the State Government, through the Director of State Audit.

The State Audit Department also regulates the audit of Salaries and Pensions. If any discrepancies are noticed, and are communicated to the university for necessary rectification, recovery etc., The State Audit verifies the service registers and pay fixations of both teaching and non-teaching staff during wage revisions.

16. Statutory Bodies
